OPTIMAS' RESPONSIBLE MINERALS SOURCING STATEMENT

Optimas is committed to conducting business ethically and responsibly throughout its supply chain. We support internationally recognized standards for human rights, environmental stewardship, and responsible sourcing, including the principles of the United Nations Global Compact.

Certain minerals and metals, including tin, tantalum, tungsten, gold ("3TG"), cobalt, and other materials used in manufacturing, may originate from regions affected by conflict, instability, human rights abuses, or other significant risks. Optimas recognizes the importance of responsible mineral sourcing and supports industry efforts to promote transparency, traceability, and responsible business conduct within global supply chains.

Optimas supports the objectives of the OECD Due Diligence Guidance for Responsible Supply Chains of Minerals from Conflict-Affected and High-Risk Areas and encourages suppliers to implement risk-based due diligence processes consistent with the OECD's five-step framework. We expect suppliers to identify, assess, and address risks within their supply chains and to cooperate with reasonable requests for information regarding the origin and sourcing of minerals and metals supplied to Optimas.

Optimas is committed to strengthening responsible minerals sourcing practices through ongoing supplier engagement and continuous improvement. By the end of 2027, Optimas aims to enhance supplier awareness and understanding of responsible minerals sourcing expectations by promoting greater transparency, risk identification, due diligence practices and alignment with internationally recognised standards, including the OECD Due Diligence Guidance for Responsible Supply Chains of Minerals from Conflict-Affected and High-Risk Areas. Progress will be supported through supplier communications, contractual expectations, due diligence activities and collaborative discussions with relevant suppliers.

By the end of 2027, Optimas aims to communicate its Responsible Minerals Sourcing expectations to 100% of strategic suppliers and to incorporate responsible sourcing requirements into supplier onboarding and review processes where appropriate

Although Optimas is not currently subject to the conflict minerals reporting requirements of Rule 13p-1 under the U.S. Securities Exchange Act, we expect our suppliers to maintain policies, procedures, and management systems designed to support responsible sourcing and compliance with applicable legal, regulatory, and customer requirements.

Optimas reserves the right to take appropriate action, including reviewing or reassessing supplier relationships, where suppliers fail to demonstrate an appropriate commitment to responsible sourcing practices or fail to address identified risks in a timely and effective manner.

We will continue to monitor developments in responsible sourcing regulations, industry standards, and OECD guidance, and work collaboratively with our suppliers and customers to support ethical and sustainable supply chains.
